This document outlines the current policy regarding visitors at the NHERI@UCSD LHPOST6 site. The site reserves the right to change the visitor policy without prior notification. This document will be updated accordingly to reflect any changes in policy.

The LHPOST6 is an outdoor facility, and as such has the capacity to host a large number of visitors. However, depending on a variety of factors, the number of visitors on site will be limited to ensure the safety of all visitors. During shake table tests, the maximum number of visitors is 100. Visitors are only permitted in the designated outdoor viewing area outlined by the site staff. No seating is provided to visitors. Closed-toe shoes are required at all times on site.

We often provide tours of our facility. These tours typically include a presentation highlighting the capabilities of our facility and videos from past experiments. Due to the maximum occupancy limitations of our conference room, the maximum number of visitors for these tours is 30 per group. For larger groups, the visitors will be split into smaller groups and tours and presentations will be provided for each group in intervals. Seating is provided to visitors during the presentations. Visitors that opt out of the walking tour will be asked to remain in the conference room and rejoin the group after completion of the walking tour.

Closed-toe shoes are required at all times (safety shoes are recommended) and hard hats are provided to visitors for tours. All visitors must check-in at trailer #1 prior to touring the site. In addition to the standard check-in, all visitors are required to complete the University mandated COVID-19 questionnaire and symptom checker. Visitors are also required to follow UCSD's mask policy found at the Return to Learn website.

Heavy construction activity occurs on a near continuous basis at LHPOST6. As a result, for safety precautions, visitors will be restricted to areas not affected by construction. Management and technical staff will be responsible for defining these areas and informing visitors of these restrictions. Failure to stay outside of restricted areas, or follow any other site safety guidelines, may result in the immediate expulsion from the site.
